102	FROM A RESIDENTIAL ROOFTOP FOR NONPOTABLE OUTDOOR

## **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. **Section 1** of the bill allows the collection of precipitation from a residential rooftop if:

- ! A maximum of 2 rain barrels with a combined storage capacity of 100 gallons or less are used;
  - Precipitation is collected from the rooftop of a building that

is used primarily as a single-family residence or a multi-family residence with 4 or fewer units;

- ! The collected precipitation is used on the residential property on which the precipitation is collected; and
- ! The collected precipitation is applied to outdoor purposes such as lawn irrigation and gardening.

Section 1 of the bill also requires the state engineer, to the extent practicable within existing resources, to provide information on the permitted use of rain barrels on the state engineer's web site.

**Section 2** requires the department of public health and environment, to the extent practicable within existing resources, to develop best practices for nonpotable usage of collected precipitation and vector control and to post any best practices developed on the department's web site.

**Section 3** prevents a homeowners' association from prohibiting a unit owner from using rain barrels for precipitation collection.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add** article 96.5 to 3 title 37 as follows: **ARTICLE 96.5** 4 5 **Rooftop Precipitation Collection** 37-96.5-101. Definitions. AS USED IN THIS ARTICLE, UNLESS THE 6 7 CONTEXT OTHERWISE REQUIRES: "RAIN BARREL" MEANS A STORAGE CONTAINER WITH A 8 (1) 9 SEALABLE LID LOCATED ABOVE GROUND OUTSIDE OF A RESIDENTIAL HOME 10 THAT IS USED FOR COLLECTING PRECIPITATION FROM A DOWNSPOUT OF A 11 ROOFTOP. 12 (2) "SINGLE-FAMILY RESIDENCE" MEANS A PRIVATE RESIDENCE 13 THAT IS A SEPARATE BUILDING OR AN INDIVIDUAL RESIDENCE THAT IS 14 PART OF A ROW OF RESIDENCES JOINED BY COMMON SIDEWALLS. 15 37-96.5-102. 26	<b>SECTION 2.</b> In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 25-1.5-210 as
27	follows:

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1	25-1.5-210. Best practices for residential rooftop precipitation
2	collection. (1) WITH RESPECT TO THE USE OF A RAIN BARREL, AS DEFINED
3	IN SECTION 37-96.5-101 (1), C.R.S., TO COLLECT PRECIPITATION FROM A
4	RESIDENTIAL ROOFTOP PURSUANT TO SECTION 37-96.5-102, C.R.S., THE
5	DEPARTMENT, TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE WITHIN EXISTING RESOURCES,
6	SHALL DEVELOP BEST PRACTICES FOR:
7	(a) NONPOTABLE USAGE OF THE COLLECTED PRECIPITATION; AND
8	(b) VECTOR CONTROL.
9	(2) If the department develops best practices in
10	ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION, THE DEPARTMENT
11	SHALL:
12	(a) Post the best practices on the department's web site;
13	AND
14	(b) Inform the state engineer of the best practices so that
15	THE STATE ENGINEER CAN EITHER POST OR LINK TO THE DEPARTMENT'S
16	BEST PRACTICES ON THE STATE ENGINEER'S WEB SITE.
17	SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 38-33.3-106.5, add
18	(1) (j) as follows:
19	38-33.3-106.5. Prohibitions contrary to public policy -
20	patriotic and political expression - emergency vehicles - fire
21	prevention - renewable energy generation devices - affordable
22	housing - drought prevention measures - definitions.
23	(1) Notwithstanding any provision in the declaration, bylaws, or rules
24	and regulations of the association to the contrary, an association shall not
25	prohibit any of the following:
26	(j) The use of a rain barrel, as defined in section
27	37-96.5-101(1), C.R.S., to collect precipitation from a residential

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2	<b>SECTION 4. Act subject to petition - effective date.</b> This act
3	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
4	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly
5	(August 5, 2015, if adjournment sine die is on May 6, 2015); except that,
6	if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of
7	the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
8	within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
9	unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
10	November 2016 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
11	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
