101 CONCERNING SECURITY FOR THE COLORADO GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

Bill Summary

The bill requires the Colorado state patrol to:

- Provide protection for members of the general assembly when they are present in the state capitol buildings group;
- ! Respond to complaints relating to criminal activity or security threats against members of the general assembly;
- Provide adequate security for legislative buildings, grounds, and other facilities and to coordinate these security efforts with security officers of each house of the

FOR 10 PURPOSES OF THIS SUBSECTION (1), "STATE CAPITOL BUILDINGS GROUP" 11 SHALL HAVE THE SAME MEANING AS SET FORTH IN SECTION 24-82-105 (1) 12 (a). 13 (2) THE COLORADO STATE PATROL SHALL PROVIDE ____ <u>LAW</u> 14 ENFORCEMENT SERVICES FOR THE BUILDINGS, GROUNDS, AND OTHER 15 FACILITIES IN WHICH THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY DESIGNATES AND ASSIGNS 16 SPACE IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 2-2-321, C.R.S. 13	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
14	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
15	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
