- 1. Exercise religious freedom, including the right to attend a religious service;

- (b) A significant emergency order may provide an exception for first responders as defined in s. 112.1815(1), health care practitioners as defined in s. 456.001, and employees of a public utility as defined in s. 366.02(1).
- (c) It is the intent of the Legislature to minimize the negative effects of an extended significant emergency order issued by a political subdivision. Notwithstanding any other law, a significant emergency order issued by a political subdivision must be narrowly tailored to serve a compelling public health or safety purpose. Any such emergency order must be limited in duration, applicability, and scope in order to

54	days after issuance but may be extended, as necessary, in 7-day
55	increments for a total duration of not more than 42 days.
