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1	A JOINT RESOLUTION directing the establishment of the Gun Violence
2	Prevention Task Force.
3	WHEREAS, gun violence is an epidemic plaguing every state in the country; and
4	WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States passed the Bipartisan Safer
5	Communities Act in 2022 in an effort to reduce gun crime; and
6	WHEREAS, both Democrats and Republicans, including Senate Minority Leader
7	Mitch McConnell, supported the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act, demonstrating that
8	preventing gun violence is an area where legislators can reach a bipartisan consensus; and
9	WHEREAS, Kentucky has one of the nation's highest rates of gun violence; and
10	WHEREAS, the rate of gun deaths in Kentucky has increased 38 percent from 2013
11	to 2022, with 826 Kentuckians dying from gun violence in an average year; and
12	WHEREAS, the General Assembly recognizes that gun violence is a serious
13	problem in Kentucky, as evidenced by the passage of House Bill 5 and Senate Bill 20
14	during the 2024 Regular Session; and
15	WHEREAS, the General Assembly has a sacred obligation to ensure that citizens of
16	the Commonwealth can live in peace and freedom, which includes the freedom to live
17	without fear of gun violence; and
18	WHEREAS, the General Assembly can accomplish that goal without interfering
19	with the right of law-abiding citizens to keep and bear arms;
20	NOW, THEREFORE,
21	Be it resolved by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
22	→Section 1. The Legislative Research Commission is hereby directed to create
23	the Gun Violence Prevention Task Force to study the causes of gun violence and to
24	examine ways to prevent gun violence in the Commonwealth of Kentucky. The Gun
25	Violence Prevention Task Force shall:
26	(1) Study the causes and contributing factors to gun violence in the
27	Commonwealth of Kentucky;

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1 (2)Review data on both fatal and nonfatal gun-related incidents in Kentucky; 2 (3) Collect data to examine the impact of gun violence on the Medicaid budget; 3 Examine existing laws in the Commonwealth that address the issue of gun (4) 4 violence and assess their effectiveness; 5 Review studies and legislative action by other states and the federal (5)6 government on the causes and costs of gun violence; 7 Identify existing resources to prevent gun violence; (6)8 (7)Recommend new laws, or changes to existing law, to reduce the rate of gun 9 violence; and 10 Take any other action the task force deems necessary to study the issue of gun (8) 11 violence in the Commonwealth. 12 \rightarrow Section 2. The Gun Violence Prevention Task Force shall be composed of the 13 following members, with final membership of the task force being subject to the 14 consideration and approval of the Legislative Research Commission: 15 Three members of the House of Representatives, including two members (1)16 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, one of whom shall be 17 designated to serve as co-chair, and one member of the minority party in the House of 18 Representatives appointed by the Minority Floor Leader in the House of Representatives; 19 Three members of the Senate, including two members appointed by the (2)20 President of the Senate, one of whom shall be designated to serve as co-chair, and one 21 member of the minority party in the Senate appointed by the Minority Floor Leader in the 22 Senate; 23 (3)The secretary of the Justice and Public Safety Cabinet; 24 (4) The commissioner of the Department of Kentucky State Police; 25 (5)The commissioner of the Department of Juvenile Justice; 26 (6) The commissioner of the Department for Behavioral Health, Developmental 27 and Intellectual Disabilities;

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1	(7)	One representative from the Department for Medicaid Services;	
2	(8)	The commissioner of the Department for Public Health;	
3	(9)	The public advocate; and	
4	(10)	Ten members to be appointed by the Legislative Research Commission as	
5	follows:		
6	(a)	One member representing research or educational institutions that study gun	
7	violence;		
8	(b)	One member representing the Kentucky Center for School Safety;	
9	(c)	One member representing hospitals and the medical field;	
10	(d)	One member representing owners of gun stores;	
11	(e)	One member representing community- or faith-based organizations;	
12	(f)	One licensed clinical social worker who has experience in suicide prevention;	
13	(g)	One member representing victims of gun violence;	
14	(h)	One member representing survivors of domestic violence and abuse;	
15	(i)	One member of the Commonwealth's Attorneys Association from a list of	
16	three nominees recommended by the Attorney General; and		
17	(j)	One member representing law enforcement.	
18	⇒Se	ection 3. The Gun Violence Prevention Task Force shall meet at least once per	
19	month du	ring the 2025 Interim of the General Assembly and shall submit its findings,	
20	legislative recommendations, or a memorandum to the Legislative Research Commission		
21	no later than December 1, 2025. If legislative recommendations are submitted, the		
22	Legislative Research Commission may refer the recommendations to the appropriate		
23	committee or committees of jurisdiction in advance of the 2026 Regular Session of the		
24	General Assembly.		
25	⇒Se	ection 4. Provisions of this Resolution to the contrary notwithstanding, the	
26	Legislative Research Commission shall have the authority to alternatively assign the		

27 issues identified herein to an interim joint committee or subcommittee thereof, and to

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1 designate a study completion date.
