The entire sentence of imprisonment, not 16 to exceed the first three years for sentences greater than three years, shall be 17

<u>Present law</u> defines and provides relative to the crime of illegal carrying of a firearm at a parade. <u>Present law</u> provides that whoever commits the crime of illegal carrying of a firearm at a parade with a firearm used in the commission of a crime of violence within 1,000 feet of any parade or demonstration for which a permit is issued by a governmental entity will be fined up to \$2,000 or imprisoned, with or without hard labor, for between one year and five years, or both.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires that up to the first three years of any sentence of imprisonment be served without benefit of parole, probation, or suspension of sentence, and otherwise retains present law.

<u>Present law</u> defines reckless discharge of a firearm at a parade or demonstration as the reckless or criminally negligent discharge of a firearm within 1,000 feet of any parade, demonstration, or gathering for which a permit is issued by a governmental entity.

<u>Present law</u> provides an exception for possession of a firearm within 1,000 feet of a public gathering but entirely within a private residence, or in accordance with a concealed handgun permit issued pursuant to <u>present law</u> relative to a special officer's commission from state police.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds an exception for a concealed handgun permit issued pursuant to <u>present law</u> relative to the issuance of concealed handgun permits generally.

Effective August 1, 2024.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Judiciary C to the original bill

- 1. Change mandatory minimum sentence for illegally carrying a firearm at a parade <u>from</u> one year <u>to</u> three years.
- 2. Add exception to the crime of reckless discharge of a firearm at a parade for concealed handgun permits issued pursuant to <u>present law</u> relative to the issuance of concealed handgun permits generally.
