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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Center for Firearm Violence Prevention and Intervention – Resources, Tools,**  
3 **and Educational Materials**

4 FOR the purpose of altering the powers of the Center for Firearm Violence Prevention and  
5 Intervention to include the creation of certain resources, tools, and educational  
6 materials related to firearms; authorizing the Center to consult with State and local  
7 agencies and third-party organizations in carrying out those powers; and generally  
8 relating to the Center for Firearm Violence Prevention and Intervention.

9 BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments,

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
20 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 **Article – Health – General**

22 13–5201.

23 In this subtitle, “Center” means the Center for Firearm Violence Prevention and  
24 Intervention.

2 (b) The purpose of the Center is to reduce firearm violence, harm from firearm  
3 violence, and misuse of firearms in the State by partnering with federal, State, and local  
4 agencies and affected communities to implement a public health approach to firearm  
5 violence reduction.

6 13-5204.

7 (a) The Center shall:

8 (1) Work in consultation with the Governor's Office of Crime Prevention,  
9 Youth, and Victim Services or any successor agency, the Maryland State Police, and any  
10 other relevant State or local agency to ensure a multidepartmental approach to reducing  
11 firearm violence;

12 (2) Solicit and consider recommendations from:

13 (i) Communities disproportionately impacted by firearm violence;

14 (ii) Public health experts;

15 (iii) Individuals or organizations with expertise in firearm safety and  
16 training; and

17 (iv) Any other experts, groups, or organizations as the executive  
18 director determines appropriate and necessary; and

19 (3) (i) On or before May 1, 2025, submit a preliminary State Plan for a  
20 Public Health Approach to Reducing Firearm Violence to guide the work of the Center to  
21 the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1257 of the State Government Article, the  
22 General Assembly; and

23 (ii) On or before May 1, 2029, and every 4 years thereafter, submit a  
24 State Strategic Plan for Firearm Violence Reduction Using Public Health Strategies to the  
25 Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1257 of the State Government Article, the General  
26 Assembly.

27 (b) The Center may:

28 (1) Offer training and technical assistance to State and local agencies,  
29 health care professionals, and community and faith-based organizations to increase  
30 capacity to implement evidence-based firearm violence prevention and intervention  
31 strategies;

1           (2) Issue best practice guidance and model processes in consultation with  
2 affected communities regarding implementation of evidence-based firearm violence  
3 prevention and intervention strategies;

4           (3) In consultation with the Governor's Office of Crime Prevention, Youth,  
5 and Victim Services or any successor agency, facilitate cross-jurisdictional data and  
6 information sharing;

7           (4) **(I) Conduct public awareness campaigns AND CREATE**  
8 **RESOURCES, TOOLS, AND EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS RELATED TO:**

9                           **1. THE SECURE STORAGE OF FIREARMS;**

10                           **2. EXTREME RISK PROTECTIVE ORDERS;**

11                           **3. SUICIDE PREVENTION, INCLUDING THE 9-8-8**  
12 **SUICIDE AND CRISIS LIFELINE; AND**

13                           **4. ANY OTHER TOPICS THE CENTER DETERMINES**  
14 **APPROPRIATE AND NECESSARY TO PROMOTE FIREARM SAFETY IN THE STATE; AND**

15                           **(II) CONSULT WITH STATE AND LOCAL AGENCIES AND**  
16 **THIRD-PARTY ORGANIZATIONS IN CARRYING OUT THE POWERS ESTABLISHED**  
17 **UNDER ITEM (I) OF THIS ITEM;**

18           (5) Share data and collaborate with higher education and research  
19 institutions regarding the prevention of firearm violence;

20           (6) Promote the development of evidence-based firearm violence  
21 prevention initiatives in affected communities throughout the State; and

22           (7) Engage in any other activity consistent with the Center's mission.

23           SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
24 October 1, 2025.
