CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Safety – Handgun Permits – Expiration and Renewal Periods for Retired**
3 **Law Enforcement Officer**

4 FOR the purpose of establishing alternative expiration and renewal periods for a handgun
5 permit issued to a certain retired law enforcement officer; and generally relating to
6 handgun permits.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article – Public Safety**

2 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

3 (c) “Permit” means a permit issued by the Secretary to carry, wear, or transport
4 a handgun.

5 5–304.

6 (b) (1) Subject to subsections (c) and (d) of this section, the Secretary may
7 charge a nonrefundable fee payable when an application is filed for a permit.

8 (d) The Secretary may not charge a fee under subsection (b) of this section to:

9 (2) a retired law enforcement officer of the State or a county or municipal
10 corporation of the State.

11 5–309.

12 (a) Except as provided in [subsection] **SUBSECTIONS (d) AND (E)** of this section,
13 a permit expires on the last day of the holder’s birth month following 2 years after the date
14 the permit is issued.

15 (b) [Subject] **EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION**
16 **AND SUBJECT** to subsection (c) of this section, a permit may be renewed for successive
17 periods of 3 years each if, at the time of an application for renewal, the applicant possesses
18 the qualifications for the issuance of a permit and pays the renewal fee stated in this
19 subtitle.

20 (c) A person who applies for a renewal of a permit is not required to be
21 fingerprinted unless the Secretary requires a set of the person’s fingerprints to resolve a
22 question of the person’s identity.

23 (d) The Secretary may establish an alternative expiration date for a permit to
24 coincide with the expiration of a license, certification, or commission for:

25 (1) a private detective under Title 13 of the Business Occupations and
26 Professions Article;

27 (2) a security guard under Title 19 of the Business Occupations and
28 Professions Article; or

29 (3) a special police officer under § 3–306 of this article.

30 **(E) A PERMIT ISSUED TO A RETIRED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER WHO**
31 **RETIRED IN GOOD STANDING FROM SERVICE WITH A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY**

1 OF THE STATE OR A COUNTY OR MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE:

2 (1) EXPIRES ON THE LAST DAY OF THE HOLDER'S BIRTH MONTH
3 FOLLOWING 5 YEARS AFTER THE DATE THE PERMIT IS ISSUED; AND

4 (2) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, MAY BE RENEWED
5 FOR SUCCESSIVE PERIODS OF 5 YEARS EACH IF, AT THE TIME OF AN APPLICATION
6 FOR RENEWAL, THE APPLICANT POSSESSES THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR THE
7 ISSUANCE OF A PERMIT.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
9 October 1, 2025.
