Amend SS/SCS/Senate Bill No. 890, Page 1, Section Title, Line 27,

2 by striking "obsolete"; and

3 Further amend said bill, page 3, section 23.295, line  
4 6, by inserting after all of said line the following:

5 "37.1300. For the purposes of sections 37.1300 to  
6 37.1330, the following terms mean:

7 (1) "Council", the Missouri GIS advisory council  
8 established in section 37.1310;

9 (2) "Geographic information system (GIS)", a computer  
10 system for capturing, storing, checking, and displaying data  
11 related to positions on the Earth's surface that enables  
12 easily seeing, analyzing, and understanding patterns and  
13 relationships;

14 (3) "Geospatial", relating to or denoting data that is  
15 associated with a particular location;

16 (4) "Missouri Spatial Data Information Service" or  
17 "MSDIS", Missouri's primary spatial data clearinghouse  
18 responsible for collecting and distributing vector data,  
19 aerial photography, and light detection and ranging  
20 elevation data that are generated, updated, and funded by  
21 state, local, and regional agencies and governments.

22 37.1310. There is hereby established within the office  
23 of administration the "Missouri GIS Advisory Council", which  
24 is charged with assisting and advising the state in ensuring  
25 the availability, implementation, and enhancement of a

26 statewide geospatial data infrastructure common to all  
27 jurisdictions. The council shall be established within the  
28 information technology services division of the office of  
29 administration. The council shall serve to support the  
30 existing geospatial infrastructure within the state of  
31 Missouri and strive toward immediate access to statewide  
32 geospatial data for all citizens of this state, especially  
33 life-safety entities including NG9-1-1.

34 37.1320. 1. The council shall consist of members that  
35 represent a cross-section of subject matter experts striking  
36 a geographic balance from all regions across the state.

37 Representation should at a minimum include:

38 (1) The commissioner of administration, or the  
39 commissioner's designee;

40 (2) The director of the department of conservation, or  
41 the director's designee;

42 (3) The director of the department of economic  
43 development, or the director's designee;

44 (4) The director of the department of health and  
45 senior services, or the director's designee;

46 (5) The director of the department of natural  
47 resources, or the director's designee;

48 (6) The adjutant general of the department of the  
49 national guard, or the adjutant general's designee;

50 (7) The director of the department of public safety,  
51 or the director's designee;

52 (8) The director of the department of transportation,  
53 or the director's designee;

54 (9) The director of the United States Geological  
55 Survey, or the director's designee;

56 (10) The chief of the United States Department of  
57 Agriculture - Natural Resource Conservation Service, or the  
58 chief's designee;

59           (11) The chair of the Missouri 911 service board, or  
60 the chair's designee;

61           (12) The director of the Missouri Spatial Data  
62 Information Service, or the director's designee;

63           (13) The director of the state land surveyor program,  
64 or the director's designee;

65           (14) Director of the National Geospatial Agency West,  
66 or the director's designee;

67           (15) Secretary of state, or the secretary's designee;  
68 and

69           (16) No less than fourteen citizens of Missouri,  
70 appointed by the commissioner of administration or the  
71 commissioner's designee. Such individuals shall represent  
72 federal, city, county, and local government; the private  
73 sector; public safety; licensed professional land surveyors;  
74 and academia.

75           2. By invitation of the council, additional subject  
76 matter experts may participate in activities as non-council  
77 members and do not require an appointment by the  
78 commissioner of administration.

79           3. Appointed members of the council shall serve two-  
80 year terms and shall serve until their successors are  
81 appointed. Vacancies on the council shall be filled in the  
82 same manner as the original appointment and such member  
83 appointed shall serve the remainder of the unexpired term.

84           4. The council shall convene, at a minimum, quarterly  
85 and as otherwise required by the commissioner of  
86 administration or the office of geospatial information.

87           5. The council shall designate from its members a  
88 chair and chair-elect for one-year terms and shall adopt  
89 written guidelines to govern the management of the council.

90           6. Each appointed member of the council shall serve  
91 without compensation but may be reimbursed for the actual

92 and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their  
93 duties as members of the council, subject to appropriations  
94 for the council.

95 7. The council shall designate from its members an  
96 executive secretary for the council, who shall maintain the  
97 records and decisions of the council's activities in  
98 accordance with state statute and shall be responsible for  
99 correspondence between the council and other agencies.

100 8. The council shall not collect any personally  
101 identifiable information of any individual person. For  
102 purposes of this subsection, the term "personally  
103 identifiable information" means information that can be used  
104 to distinguish or trace an individual's identity, such as  
105 name, social security number, or biometric data records,  
106 either alone or when combined with other personal or  
107 identifying information that is linked or linkable to a  
108 specific individual."; and

109 Further amend the title and enacting clause accordingly.
