Committee:

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to create and provide duties for
- the School Financing Review Commission; to state intent relating to
- appropriations; and to declare an emergency.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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- 1 Section 1. (1) The School Financing Review Commission is created.
- 2 The commission shall consist of nineteen members, including: (a) Three
- 3 members of the Legislature, appointed by the Executive Board of the
- 4 Legislative Council; (b) two members representing postsecondary
- 5 education, with expertise in the area of school finance; (c) the
- 6 Commissioner of Education or his or her designee; (d) a representative of
- 7 the Governor; (e) two members, each residing in a Class II school
- 8 district; (f) two members, each residing in a Class III school district;
- 9 (g) two members, each residing in a Class IV school district; (h) two
- 10 members, each residing in a Class V school district; (i) two members from
- 11 the state at large; (j) one member representing an educational service
- 12 <u>unit serving a rural area; and (k) one member representing an educational</u>
- 13 <u>service unit serving an urban area.</u>
- 14 (2) The members described in subdivisions (1)(b) and (d) through (k)
- 15 of this section shall be appointed by the Governor with the approval of
- 16 the Legislature within thirty days after the effective date of this act
- 17 to serve through December 31, 2016. Vacancies shall be filled by the
- 18 Governor for the remainder of the term. Members of the commission shall
- 19 not receive any compensation for their services but shall be reimbursed
- 20 for their actual and necessary expenses incurred as members of the
- 21 <u>commission as provided in sections 81-1174 to 81-1177.</u>
- 22 (3) The commission shall cease to exist on December 31, 2016.
- 23 Sec. 2. The School Financing Review Commission shall conduct an in-
- 24 <u>depth review of the financing of the public elementary and secondary</u>
- 25 schools. The commission shall:
- 26 (1) Examine the option of using income as a component in the
- 27 <u>financing of schools;</u>
- 28 (2) Examine the option of using sales tax as a component for local
- 29 school funding, including, but not limited to, the experience of any
- 30 <u>other states with such option;</u>
- 31 (3) Examine financing methods used in other states which offer

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- 1 alternatives to heavy reliance on property tax;
- 2 (4) Examine financing issues as they relate to the quality and
- 3 performance of the schools;
- 4 (5) Examine options for funding expanded prekindergarten services;
- 5 (6) Examine the costs and resources necessary to educate students in
- 6 poverty and those with limited English proficiency;
- 7 (7) Examine methods used by other states to fund kindergarten
- through twelfth grade infrastructure needs; and 8
- 9 (8) Prepare a report with recommendations and a plan to implement
- 10 the recommendations. The report shall be presented electronically to the
- 11 Legislature by December 1, 2016.
- 12 Sec. 3. The School Financing Review Commission may:
- 13 (1) Hire staff, including, but not limited to, consultants;
- (2) Obtain assistance from the State Department of Education and the 14
- 15 Department of Revenue in acquiring data needed to carry out its duties;
- 16 and
- 17 (3) Contract for any necessary facilities, equipment, and services,
- 18 including computer services.
- 19 It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate from the Sec. 4.
- General Fund such money as may be necessary to permit the School 20
- Financing Review Commission to carry out its duties. The appropriation 21
- 22 shall be at least one hundred thousand dollars.
- 23 Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
- 24 passed and approved according to law.
