Committee:

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to community colleges; to amend section
- 2 85-1539, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to adopt the
- 3 Community College Gap Assistance Program Act; to harmonize
- 4 provisions; and to repeal the original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 11 of this act shall be known and may be

- 2 <u>cited as the Community College Gap Assistance Program Act.</u>
- 3 Sec. 2. For purposes of the Community College Gap Assistance
- 4 Program Act:
- 5 (1) Committee means the Nebraska Community College Student
- 6 Performance and Occupational Education Grant Committee;
- 7 (2) Community college gap assistance program means the program
- 8 created pursuant to section 3 of this act;
- 9 (3) Eligible program means a program offered by a community college
- 10 that is not offered for credit but is aligned with training programs with
- 11 <u>stackable credentials that lead to a program awarding college credit, an</u>
- 12 <u>associate's degree, diploma, or certificate in an in-demand occupation,</u>
- 13 <u>has a duration of not less than sixteen contact hours in length, and does</u>
- 14 any of the following:
- 15 (a) Offers a state, national, or locally recognized certificate;
- (b) Offers preparation for a professional examination or licensure;
- 17 (c) Provides endorsement for an existing credential or license;
- 18 (d) Represents recognized skill standards defined by an industrial
- 19 sector; or
- 20 (e) Offers a similar credential or training; and
- 21 (4) In-demand occupation means:
- 22 (a) Financial services;
- 23 (b) Transportation, warehousing, and distribution logistics;
- 24 (c) Precision metals manufacturing;
- 25 (d) Biosciences;
- (e) Renewable energy;
- 27 <u>(f) Agriculture and food processing;</u>
- 28 (g) Business management and administrative services;
- 29 <u>(h) Software and computer services;</u>
- 30 (i) Research, development, and engineering services;
- 31 (j) Health services;

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- 1 (k) Hospitality and tourism; and
- 2 (1) Any other industry designated as an in-demand occupation by the
- 3 committee.
- 4 Sec. 3. (1) The Community College Gap Assistance Program is
- 5 <u>created. The purpose of the community college gap assistance program is</u>
- 6 to provide funding to community colleges to award community college gap
- 7 assistance to students in eligible programs.
- 8 (2) To be eligible for community college gap assistance under the
- 9 <u>community college gap assistance program, an applicant:</u>
- 10 (a) Shall have a family income which is at or below two hundred
- 11 <u>fifty percent of Office of Management and Budget income poverty</u>
- 12 <u>guidelines; and</u>
- 13 (b) Shall be a resident of Nebraska as provided in section 85-502.
- 14 (3) Eligibility for such tuition assistance shall not be construed
- 15 <u>to guarantee enrollment in any eligible program.</u>
- Sec. 4. <u>Application for community college gap assistance under the</u>
- 17 <u>community college gap assistance program shall be made to the community</u>
- 18 <u>college in which the applicant is enrolled or intends to enroll. An</u>
- 19 application shall be valid for six months from the date of signature on
- 20 the application. The applicant shall provide documentation of all sources
- 21 of income. An applicant shall not receive community college gap
- 22 assistance for more than one eligible program.
- 23 Sec. 5. (1) An applicant for community college gap assistance under
- 24 the community college gap assistance program shall demonstrate capacity
- 25 to achieve the following outcomes:
- (a) The ability to be accepted to and complete an eligible program;
- 27 <u>(b) The ability to be accepted into and complete a postsecondary</u>
- 28 certificate, diploma, or degree program for credit;
- 29 (c) The ability to obtain full-time employment; and
- 30 (d) The ability to maintain full-time employment over time.
- 31 (2) The committee may grant community college gap assistance under

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1 the community college gap assistance program to an applicant in any

- 2 <u>amount up to the full amount of eligible costs.</u>
- 3 (3) The committee shall deny an application when the community
- 4 college receiving the application determines that funding for an
- 5 applicant's participation in an eligible program is available from any
- 6 other public or private funding source.
- 7 Sec. 6. <u>The eligible costs for which the committee may award</u>
- 8 <u>community college gap assistance under the community college gap</u>
- 9 <u>assistance program include</u>, but are not limited to:
- 10 <u>(1) Tuition;</u>
- 11 (2) Direct training costs;
- 12 <u>(3) Required books and equipment; and</u>
- 13 (4) Fees, including, but not limited to, fees for industry testing
- 14 services and background check services.
- 15 Sec. 7. An applicant for community college gap assistance under the
- 16 community college gap assistance program shall complete an initial
- 17 assessment administered by the community college receiving the
- 18 <u>application to determine the applicant's readiness to complete an</u>
- 19 <u>eligible program. The initial assessment shall include any assessments</u>
- 20 <u>required by the eligible program.</u>
- 21 Sec. 8. (1) A recipient of community college gap assistance under
- 22 the community college gap assistance program shall:
- 23 <u>(a) Maintain regular contact with faculty of the eligible program to</u>
- 24 <u>document the applicant's progress in the program;</u>
- 25 (b) Sign any necessary releases to provide relevant information to
- 26 community college faculty or case managers, if applicable;
- 27 (c) Discuss with faculty of the eligible program any issues that may
- 28 affect the recipient's ability to complete the eligible program and
- 29 <u>obtain and maintain employment;</u>
- 30 <u>(d) Attend all required courses regularly; and</u>
- 31 (e) Meet with faculty of the eligible program to develop a job-

- 1 search plan.
- 2 (2) A community college may terminate college gap assistance under
- 3 the college gap assistance program for a recipient who fails to meet the
- 4 requirements of this section.
- 5 Sec. 9. (1) The Community College Gap Assistance Program Fund is
- 6 created. The fund shall be administered by the committee. Any money in
- 7 the fund available for investment shall be invested by the state
- 8 <u>investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the</u>
- 9 <u>Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.</u>
- 10 (2) The total of community college gap assistance awarded from the
- 11 <u>Community College Gap Assistance Program Fund during any fiscal year</u>
- 12 <u>shall not exceed one million five hundred thousand dollars.</u>
- 13 (3) Money in the fund may also be used by the committee:
- 14 (a) To establish application and funding procedures; and
- 15 (b) To assist community colleges in defraying the costs of direct
- 16 staff support services, including, but not limited to, marketing,
- 17 <u>outreach, applications, interviews, and assessments as follows: (i) Up to</u>
- 18 <u>twenty percent of any amount allocated for such purposes to the two</u>
- 19 <u>smallest community colleges; (ii) up to ten percent of any such amount to</u>
- 20 the two largest community colleges; and (iii) up to fifteen percent of
- 21 any such amount to the remaining two community colleges. For purposes of
- 22 this subsection, community college size shall be determined based on the
- 23 most recent three-year rolling average full-time equivalent enrollment.
- 24 Sec. 10. (1) The committee shall develop a common applicant
- 25 tracking system for the community college gap assistance program that
- 26 <u>shall</u> be <u>implemented</u> <u>consistently</u> by <u>each</u> <u>participating</u> <u>community</u>
- 27 college.
- 28 (2) The committee shall coordinate statewide oversight, evaluation,
- 29 and reporting efforts for the community college gap assistance program.
- 30 (3) The committee shall meet at least quarterly to evaluate and
- 31 monitor the performance of the community college gap assistance program

- 1 to determine if performance measures are being met and shall take
- 2 <u>necessary steps to correct any deficiencies. Performance measures</u>
- 3 include, but are not limited to, eligible program completion rates, job
- 4 attainment rates, and continuing education rates.
- 5 Sec. 11. The committee may adopt and promulgate rules and
- 6 <u>regulations to carry out the Community College Gap Assistance Program</u>
- 7 <u>Act.</u>
- 8 Sec. 12. Section 85-1539, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 9 amended to read:
- 10 85-1539 (1) There is hereby created the Nebraska Community College
- 11 Student Performance and Occupational Education Grant Committee. The
- 12 committee shall consist of (a) a representative of the Coordinating
- 13 Commission for Postsecondary Education who shall serve as chairperson of
- 14 the committee, (b) a representative of the Department of Economic
- 15 Development, (c) a representative of the Department of Labor, (d) a
- 16 representative of the State Department of Education, (e) a representative
- 17 affiliated with one of the two community college areas with the two
- 18 smallest full-time equivalent student enrollment totals for the most
- 19 recent fiscal year, (f) a representative affiliated with one of the two
- 20 community college areas with the two largest full-time equivalent student
- 21 enrollment totals for the most recent fiscal year, and (g) a
- 22 representative affiliated with one of the two community college areas not
- 23 included in the categories provided in subdivisions (1)(e) and (f) of
- 24 this section. Each member shall be appointed by the agency or community
- 25 college areas being represented. The representatives appointed pursuant
- 26 to subdivisions (1)(e) through (g) of this section shall serve terms of
- 27 two years and shall be succeeded by a representative affiliated with the
- 28 community college areas not represented for the preceding term.
- 29 (2)(a) The committee shall develop guidelines for and annually
- 30 determine the allocation of aid or grants to the community colleges for
- 31 $(i \cdot a)$ applied technology and occupational faculty training, instructional

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- 1 equipment upgrades, employee assessment, preemployment training,
- 2 employment training, and dislocated worker programs benefiting the State
- 3 of Nebraska or $(\underline{i}\underline{i} \ b)$ programs or activities to enhance $(\underline{A} \ \dot{\underline{i}})$ student
- 4 performance in the areas of degree, certificate, or diploma completion,
- 5 retention, or foundations education as defined in section 85-932.01 or (\underline{B}
- 6 $\pm i$) the collection, reporting, analysis, and utilization of student data.
- 7 The total amount allocated for a fiscal year shall not exceed the amounts
- 8 appropriated from the Nebraska Community College Student Performance and
- 9 Occupational Education Grant Fund and such other funds as may be
- 10 appropriated by the Legislature for purposes of this section for such
- 11 fiscal year. The commission shall certify the allocation determined by
- 12 the committee on or before September 10 of the fiscal year for which such
- 13 allocation is being certified and shall report such allocation to the
- 14 Department of Administrative Services. The commission shall distribute
- 15 the allocated funds to the selected community college board or boards in
- 16 a single payment between the fifth and twentieth day of October of each
- 17 year.
- 18 $(\underline{b} \ 3)$ Applications for aid or grants pursuant to this <u>subsection</u>
- 19 section may be submitted by a community college area independently or in
- 20 collaboration with other community college areas.
- 21 (3) The committee shall administer the Community College Gap
- 22 Assistance Program Act and the College Gap Assistance Program Fund.
- 23 Sec. 13. Original section 85-1539, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 24 Nebraska, is repealed.
