1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact sections 39-29.2-05, 39-29.2-06, 39-29.2-07, 39-29.2-08,

2 39-29.2-09, 39-29.2-10, 39-29.2-11, 39-29.2-12, 39-29.2-13, 39-29.2-14, 39-29.2-15,

3 39-29.2-16, 39-29.2-17, 39-29.2-18, 39-29.2-19, and 39-29.2-20 of the North Dakota Century

4 Code, relating to unconventional vehicles; to amend and reenact subsection 3 of section

5 26.1-40-01, subsection 10 of section 26.1-41-01, subsection 49 of section 39-01-01, subsection

6 2 of section 39-29.2-01, and subsection 5 of section 39-29.2-03, and section 39-29.2-04 of the

7 North Dakota Century Code, relating to unconventional vehicles; to provide a penalty; and to

8 declare an emergency.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

10 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 26.1-40-01 of the North Dakota

- 11 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- "Policy" means any automobile policy which includes automobile liability coverage, uninsured motorist coverage, underinsured motorist coverage, automobile medical payments coverage, basic or optional excess no-fault benefits, or automobile physical damage coverage, delivered or issued for delivery in this state, insuring as the named insured an individual residing in this state, and under which the insured vehicles designated in the policy are of the following types only:
- 18 a. A motor vehicle of the private passenger or station wagon type that is not used as
 19 a public or livery conveyance, nor rented to others.
- b. Any four-wheel motor vehicle with a load capacity of one thousand five hundred
 pounds [680.39 kilograms] or less which is not used in the occupation,
- profession, or business of the insured, nor used as a public or livery conveyance,nor rented to others.

1		C.	Any motorcycle as that term is defined in section 39-01-01 that is not used as a
2			public or livery conveyance, nor rented to others.
3		<u>d.</u>	An unconventional vehicle as that term is defined in subsection 2 of section
4			39-29.2-01 that is not used as a public or livery conveyance, nor rented to others.
5		"Po	licy" does not include any policy that has been in effect less than sixty days at the
6		time	e notice of cancellation is mailed or delivered by the insurer unless it is a renewal
7		poli	cy; any policy issued under the North Dakota assigned risk plan; any policy
8		insu	iring more than six motor vehicles; any policy covering the operation of a garage,
9		auto	omobile sales agency, repair shop, service station, or public parking place; any
10		poli	cy providing insurance only on an excess basis; or any other contract providing
11		insu	irance to a named insured even though the contract may incidentally provide
12		insu	rance with respect to such motor vehicles.
13	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 10 of section 26.1-41-01 of the North Dakota		
14	Century	Code	e is amended and reenacted as follows:
15	10.	"Mo	tor vehicle" means a vehicle having more than three load-bearing wheels, of a kind
16		requ	uired to be registered under the laws of this state relating to motor vehicles,
17		des	igned primarily for operation upon the public streets, roads, and highways, and
18		driv	en by power other than muscular power, and includes a trailer drawn by or
19		atta	ched to such a vehicle. The term does not include an unconventional vehicle
20		<u>defi</u>	ned in subsection 2 of section 39-29.2-01.

19	SECTION 7. Section 39-29.2-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted		
20	as follov	NS:	
21	<u>39-29.2-05. Equipment.</u>		
22	<u>1.</u>	<u>An</u>	unconventional vehicle must be equipped with safety glass or a windshield at all
23		time	es while operating the vehicle.
24	<u>2.</u>	<u>a.</u>	An operator and any passenger under the age of eighteen shall wear protective
25			helmets, except when the unconventional vehicle has a nonremovable roof, a
26			windshield, and an enclosed body.
27		<u>b.</u>	If the operator of an unconventional vehicle is required to wear a safety helmet,
28			any passenger must also wear a safety helmet regardless of the passenger's
29			age.
30		<u>C.</u>	A helmet violation under this subsection has the same penalty as driving a
31			motorcycle without a helmet.

1 Operators and passengers in an unconventional vehicle shall comply with seatbelt use 3. 2 laws. 3 SECTION 8. Section 39-29.2-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted 4 as follows: 5 39-29.2-06. Manufacturer's or distributor's certification. 6 1. The manufacturer or distributor shall certify that an unconventional vehicle is designed 7 and manufactured for use upon public highways and complies with the performance, 8 United States environmental protection agency equipment requirements, and the rules 9 of this chapter. 10 The certificate must be incorporated on the manufacturer's statement of origin upon 2. 11 transfer of vehicle ownership. 12 SECTION 9. Section 39-29.2-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted 13 as follows: 14 39-29.2-07. Frame - Chassis - Requirements. 15 1. The unconventional vehicle frame-chassis, including the suspension components and 16 engine mountings, must be of substantial construction, capable of supporting the 17 combined weight of all vehicle components including the riders for whom the vehicle is 18 designed, and must withstand normal road shocks and operational stresses, without 19 constituting a hazard to the riders or other users of the highway. 20 The unconventional vehicle wheelbase may not be less than forty inches [101.6] <u>2.</u> 21 centimeters]. 22 SECTION 10. Section 39-29.2-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted 23 as follows: 24 39-29.2-08. Brakes. 25 1. Every unconventional vehicle must have either a split service brake system or two 26 independently actuated service brake systems, in accordance with rules adopted by 27 the director under chapter 28-32. Brakes must act on the front and rear wheels. 28 Every unconventional vehicle must meet the requirements for brake system 2. 29 effectiveness, fade, and partial systems, as specified in rules adopted by the director 30 under chapter 28-32.

1	<u>3.</u>	If applicable, all linkages, cables, pivots, and bearings must be free of excess friction,		
2		with the front wheel brake cable located and secured so as not to become pinched		
3		between the fork and frame members when the wheel is turned completely to the right		
4		<u>or left.</u>		
5	<u>4.</u>	Brake actuating devices must be in an accessible location, unencumbered by vehicle		
6		components, and positioned so that adequate leverage and safe operation is ensured.		
7		Service brake system controls and operation requirements must be in accordance with		
8		rules adopted by the director under chapter 28-32. A suitable mechanism must be		
9		provided for the purpose of automatically returning the actuating devices to normal		
10		position upon release.		
11	<u>5.</u>	Unconventional vehicles brakes must be capable of being adjusted automatically or		
12		manually with means provided to prevent unintentional adjustment.		
13	<u>6.</u>	An unconventional vehicle must be equipped with an emergency or parking brake of a		
14		friction type, with a solely mechanical means to retain engagement.		
15	<u>7.</u>	The brake system on an unconventional vehicle should be capable of stopping within		
16		a distance of thirty feet [9.14 meters] on a dry, hard, approximately level stretch of		
17		highway that is free from loose material at all times and under all conditions, at a		
18		<u>speed of twenty miles per hour [32 kilometers per hour].</u>		
19	SEC	CTION 11. Section 39-29.2-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted		
20	as follows:			
21	<u>39-</u> 2	<u>39-29.2-09. Tires, wheels, and rims.</u>		
22	<u>1.</u>	Unconventional vehicle tires must be of pneumatic design, with a minimum width of		
23		two and twenty-five hundredths inches [57.15 millimeters], and must be designed for		
24		highway use.		
25	<u>2.</u>	Tires on an unconventional vehicle must have a load capacity rating at least equal to		
26		the respective gross axle weight ratings. Each tire on the front or rear axle must have		
27		a load capacity rating at least equal to one-half the front or rear axle gross axle weight		
28		rating.		
29	<u>3.</u>	Wheel rim diameters may not be less than ten inches [25.4 centimeters] or must		
30		comply with title 49, C.F.R., part 571, federal motor vehicle safety standards, and must		
31		comply with applicable state standards, as adopted by the director.		

1 SECTION 12. Section 39-29.2-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted

2 as follows:

2	as follows:		
3	<u>39-</u> 2	29.2-10. Steering and suspension systems.	
4	<u>1.</u>	Unconventional vehicle steering and suspension systems must be designed and	
5		engineered to provide the operator with the means of safely controlling the	
6		unconventional vehicle direction under all maneuvers required for normal and safe	
7		operation.	
8	<u>2.</u>	On a three-wheel unconventional vehicle, the midpoint of the front or rear wheel track	
9		distance must be within one inch [2.54 centimeters] of the single front or single rear	
10		wheel track when the vehicle is proceeding on a straight course. If applicable, the	
11		vehicle must be equipped with an adjustment feature that will provide proper wheel	
12		tracking.	
13	<u>3.</u>	The steering head must be provided with a bearing or similar device that will allow the	
14		steering shaft to turn freely in rotational motion only.	
15	<u>4.</u>	If applicable, an unconventional vehicle must meet the following specifications in	
16		relationship to front wheel geometry:	
17		a. <u>Maximum:</u>	
18		(1) Rake - Forty-five degrees; and	
19		(2) Trail - Fourteen inches [35.56 centimeters] positive.	
20		<u>b.</u> <u>Minimum:</u>	
21		(1) Rake - Twenty degrees; and	
22		(2) Trail - Two inches [5.08 centimeters] positive.	
23	<u>5.</u>	Manufacturer's specifications must include the specific rake and trail for each	
24		unconventional vehicle. The terms "rake" and "trail" must be defined by the director by	
25		rules adopted under chapter 28-32.	
26	<u>6.</u>	The steering device must be of sturdy construction, adequate in size to provide proper	
27		leverage for steering, and capable of withstanding a minimum force of one hundred	
28		pounds [45.36 kilograms] applied to each handgrip, if so equipped, in any direction.	
29		Steering device grips may not be located above the shoulder height of the seated	
30		operator. The steering device must provide a minimum of eighteen inches [45.72	
31		centimeters] between each grip, after final assembly.	

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1	<u>7.</u>	The steering device must be equipped with material and surface patterns to ensure
2		firm, nonslip gripping for the driver.
3	<u>8.</u>	Every unconventional vehicle must be equipped with a suspension system. The
4		suspension system must be effective in reducing road shock and designed for the
5		purpose of maximizing vehicle stability.
6	SEG	CTION 13. Section 39-29.2-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted
7	as follov	NS:
8	<u>39-</u>	29.2-11. Fuel system.
9	<u>1.</u>	All fuel system components, including the tank, pump, tubing, hoses, and clamps must
10		be securely fastened to the unconventional vehicle, so as not to interfere with its
11		operation and must be leakproof when the vehicle is in its normal operating attitude.
12	<u>2.</u>	Fuel lines must be positioned so as to prevent their contact with the engine head,
13		manifold, exhaust system, or other high temperature surfaces, or with moving
14		components. The fuel system must be adequately vented and provided with a fuel
15		shutoff valve located between the fuel supply and the engine.
16	SEC	CTION 14. Section 39-29.2-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted
17	as follov	NS:
18	<u>39-</u>	29.2-12. Exhaust system - Prevention of noise.
19	<u>1.</u>	Unconventional vehicles must be equipped with an exhaust system incorporating a
20		muffler or other mechanical device, for the purpose of effectively reducing engine
21		noise.
22	<u>2.</u>	Cutouts and bypasses in the exhaust system are prohibited.
23	<u>3.</u>	The system must be leakproof and all components must be securely attached to the
24		vehicle and located so as not to interfere with the operation of the unconventional
25		vehicle.
26	<u>4.</u>	Shielding must be provided to prevent inadvertent contact with the exhaust system by
27		the operator or passenger during normal operation.
28	<u>5.</u>	An unconventional vehicle operating on streets and highways must meet the noise
29		decibel limitations as established by the United States environmental protection
30		agency.
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1	<u>6.</u>	A person may not sell, offer for sale, or install any noise suppressing system or device,	
2		which will produce noise in excess of the maximum allowable decibel limitations set	
3	forth in this section.		
4	SEC	TION 15. Section 39-29.2-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted	
5	as follow	/S:	
6	<u>39-2</u>	9.2-13. Mirror.	
7	<u>Ever</u>	ry unconventional vehicle must be equipped with two mirrors, securely affixed and	
8	<u>capable</u>	of adjustment within a range that will reflect an image that includes at least the horizon	
9	and the	road surface to the rear of the unconventional vehicle. A mirror must consist of a	
10	minimun	n reflective surface of ten square inches [64.52 square centimeters]. A mirror may not	
11	contain sharp edges or projections capable of producing injury.		
12	SEC	TION 16. Section 39-29.2-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted	
13	as follow	/S:	
14	<u>39-2</u>	9.2-14. Fenders.	
15	<u>lf ap</u>	plicable, each wheel of an unconventional vehicle must be equipped with fenders or	
16	<u>otherwis</u>	e covered by the body configuration. Fenders must be securely mounted and of	
17	sufficient size and strength to minimize water or other road surface substances from coming in		
18	contact with the vehicle riders or throwing the road substances unreasonably to the rear of the		
19	vehicle.	The fender design must be effective in reducing side spray.	
20	SEC	TION 17. Section 39-29.2-15 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted	
21	as follow	/S:	
22	<u>39-2</u>	9.2-15. Seat.	
23	<u>1.</u>	A seat securely attached to the vehicle must be provided for the use of the operator	
24		and be a permanent upright seat that does not require the operator to straddle or sit	
25		astride it. The seat adjustment locking device must prevent relative movement of the	
26		seat from its selected and secured position under all normal vehicle operating	
27		conditions.	
28	<u>2.</u>	An unconventional vehicle designed to carry more than one person must be equipped	
29		with a securely mounted seat for each passenger. The seat must be located to the	
30		side or rear of the driver so that the passenger seat does not interfere with the driver's	
31		control or operation of the vehicle.	

- Sixty-fourth Legislative Assembly 1 SECTION 18. Section 39-29.2-16 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted 2 as follows: 3 39-29.2-16. Glazing. 4 An unconventional vehicle windscreen and windshield must meet the following standards: 5 1. The glazing material must comply with the standards made by rule; 6 2. The metal support must be of a material that bends rather than fragments under 7 impact; and 8 Any covering material, other than glazing, must be beaded at the edges to prevent <u>3.</u> 9 fraying. 10 SECTION 19. Section 39-29.2-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted 11 as follows: 12 39-29.2-17. Horn.
- 13 Every unconventional vehicle must be equipped with a horn, in good working order, as
- 14 described by subsection 1 of section 39-21-36. The horn must operate from a control located on
- 15 the steering device.
- 16 SECTION 20. Section 39-29.2-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted
- 17 as follows:
- 18 39-29.2-18. Speedometer and odometer.
- 19 Every unconventional vehicle must be equipped with a properly operating speedometer and
- 20 an odometer, calibrated in miles or kilometers per hour respectively, and must be fully
- 21 illuminated when the headlamp is activated.
- 22 SECTION 21. Section 39-29.2-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted
- as follows:
- 24 <u>39-29.2-19. Lighting equipment.</u>
- 25 <u>1.</u> <u>An unconventional vehicle must be equipped with lamps, reflective devices, and</u>
- associated equipment, as required by and in compliance with standards adopted by
 rule of the director.
- 28 2. <u>A gearbox indicator light, if provided, must be located within the operator's field of</u>
 29 <u>vision.</u>
- 30 3. <u>A headlamp beam indicator light must be located within the operator's field of vision</u>
 31 and illuminated automatically when the high beam of the headlamp is actuated.

1	<u>4.</u>	An unconventional vehicle must be equipped with at least one taillamp, in accordance		
2		with section 39-21-04.		
3	<u>5.</u>	An unconventional vehicle must be equipped with a stop lamp, in accordance with		
4		subsection 1 of section 39-21-19.		
5	<u>6.</u>	An unconventional vehicle must be equipped with hazard warning signals in		
6		accordance with section 39-21-19.1.		
7	SEC	CTION 22. Section 39-29.2-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted		
8	as follow	/S:		
9	<u>39-2</u>	9.2-20. Headlamps.		
10	<u>1.</u>	The headlamp or headlamps on an unconventional vehicle must be a multiple-beam		
11		type.		
12	<u>2.</u>	The headlamp or headlamps on an unconventional vehicle must be of sufficient		
13		intensity to reveal an individual or a vehicle at a distance of not less than:		
14		a. One hundred feet [30.48 meters], when the unconventional vehicle is operated at		
15		any speed less than twenty-five miles [40.23 kilometers] per hour;		
16		b. <u>Two hundred feet [60.96 meters]</u> , when the unconventional vehicle is operated at		
17		a speed of twenty-five miles [40.23 kilometers] per hour, but less than thirty-five		
18		miles [56.33 kilometers] per hour; and		
19		c. Three hundred feet [91.44 meters], when the unconventional vehicle is operated		
20		at a speed of thirty-five miles [56.33 kilometers] per hour, or more.		
21	<u>3.</u>	An unconventional vehicle must be equipped with a multiple-beam headlamp that		
22		meets the minimum requirements set forth in this section and may not exceed the		
23		limitations set forth in subsection 1 of section 39-21-20 and the lowermost beam must		
24		meet the requirements applicable to a lowermost distribution of light as set forth in		
25		subsection 2 of section 39-21-20.		
26	SEC	TION 23. EMERGENCY. This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
