8	Section 3-132, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 212, O.S.L. 2013 (70 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 3-132), which relates to the Oklahoma Charter Schools Act;
9	authorizing sponsorship of charter schools by federally recognized Indian tribes on certain
10	property; and providing an effective date.
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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 3-132, as
15	last amended by Section 1, Chapter 212, O.S.L. 2013 (70 O.S. Supp.
16	2014, Section 3-132), is amended to read as follows:
17	Section 3-132. A. The Oklahoma Charter Schools Act shall apply
18	only to charter schools formed and operated under the provisions of
19	the act. Charter schools shall be sponsored only as follows:
20	1. By a school district with an average daily membership of
21	five thousand (5,000) or more and which all or part of the school
22	district is located in a county having more than five hundred
23	thousand (500,000) population according to the latest Federal
24	Decennial Census;

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2. By a school district which has a school site that has been
 identified as in need of improvement by the State Board of Education
 pursuant to the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, as
 amended or reauthorized;

By a technology center school district if the charter school 6 is located in a school district served by the technology center 7 school district and the school district has an average daily 8 membership of five thousand (5,000) or more and which all or part of 9 the school district is located in a county having more than five 10 hundred thousand (500,000) population according to the latest 11 Federal Decennial Census;

4. By a technology center school district if the charter school
is located in a school district served by the technology center
school district and the school district has a school site that has
been identified as in need of improvement by the State Board of
Education pursuant to the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of
1965, as amended or reauthorized;

5. By a comprehensive or regional institution that is a member of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education if the charter school is located in a school district that has an average daily membership of five thousand (5,000) or more and which all or part of the school district is located in a county having more than five hundred thousand (500,000) population according to the latest Federal Decennial Census. In addition, the institution shall have a

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1 teacher education program accredited by the Oklahoma Commission for 2 Teacher Preparation and have a branch campus or constituent agency 3 physically located within the school district in which the charter 4 school is located;

5 6. By a comprehensive or regional institution that is a member of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education if the charter 6 7 school is located in a school district that has a school site that has been identified as in need of improvement by the State Board of 8 9 Education pursuant to the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 10 1965, as amended or reauthorized. In addition, the institution 11 shall have a teacher education program accredited by the Oklahoma 12 Commission for Teacher Preparation and have a branch campus or 13 constituent agency physically located within the school district in 14 which the charter school is located;

15 7. By a federally recognized Indian tribe, operating a high 16 school under the authority of the Bureau of Indian Affairs as of 17 November 1, 2010, if the charter school is for the purpose of 18 demonstrating native language immersion instruction, and is located 19 within its former reservation or treaty area boundaries. For 20 purposes of this paragraph, native language immersion instruction 21 shall require that educational instruction and other activities 22 conducted at the school site are primarily conducted in the native 23 language; or

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8. <u>By a federally recognized Indian tribe only when the charter</u>
 <u>school is located within the former reservation or treaty area</u>
 <u>boundaries of the tribe on property held in trust by the Bureau of</u>
 <u>Indian Affairs of the United States Department of the Interior for</u>
 the benefit of the tribe; or

6 9. By the State Board of Education when the applicant of the 7 charter school is the Office of Juvenile Affairs or the applicant has a contract with the Office of Juvenile Affairs to provide a 8 9 fixed rate level E, D, or D+ group home service and the charter 10 school is for the purpose of providing education services to youth 11 in the custody or supervision of the state. Not more than two 12 charter schools shall be sponsored by the Board as provided for in 13 this paragraph during the period of time beginning July 1, 2010, 14 through July 1, 2016.

15 For purposes of the Oklahoma Charter Schools Act, "charter в. 16 school" means a public school established by contract with a board 17 of education of a school district, an area vocational-technical 18 school district, a higher education institution, a federally 19 recognized Indian tribe, or the State Board of Education pursuant to 20 the Oklahoma Charter Schools Act to provide learning that will 21 improve student achievement and as defined in the Elementary and 22 Secondary Education Act of 1965, 20 U.S.C. 8065.

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1	C. A charter school may consist of a new school site, new
2	school sites or all or any portion of an existing school site. An
3	entire school district may not become a charter school site.
4	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.
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
