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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:								
17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 2 O.S. 2011, Section 5-3.2, as								
18	amended by Section 2, Chapter 118, O.S.L. 2013 (2 O.S. Supp. 2014,								
19	Section 5-3.2), is amended to read as follows:								
20	Section 5-3.2 A. The State Board of Agriculture is hereby								
21	authorized to establish and administer the Oklahoma Agriculture								
22	Enhancement and Diversification Program.								
23	B. The purpose of the Oklahoma Agriculture Enhancement and								
24	Diversification Program is to promote and encourage the interests of								

1	agriculture through the allocation of funds, by grant or loan, to									
2	individuals, cooperatives and other agricultural entities to provide									
3	assistance to projects dealing with the development of new or									
4	expanded uses or both new and expanded uses of agricultural									
5	products, and to increase productivity, provide added value to									
6	agricultural products and benefit the agricultural producer:									
7	1. Develop new or expanded uses of agricultural products;									
8	2. Develop new or expanded benefits of agricultural events;									
9	3. Increase agricultural productivity;									
10	4. Provide added value to agricultural products or events;									
11	5. Benefit the agricultural producer; and									
12	6. Benefit the agricultural interests of Oklahoma.									
13	C. The Program shall consist of the following categories:									
14	1. Cooperative marketing grants and loans to be available to									
15	for entities or individuals wishing intending to work together to									
16	develop or establish production, processing or marketing of									
17	agricultural products. The purpose of this category is to provide									
18	funding for promoting productivity, providing added value to									
19	agricultural products, stimulating and fostering agricultural									
20	diversification and encouraging processing innovations;									
21	2. Marketing and utilization grants and loans to be used to									
22	assist in the development or implementation of sound domestic or									
23	foreign marketing plans for Oklahoma agricultural products, by-									

24 products, or new and better uses for existing agricultural products

1 by through the financing of marketing feasibility studies, business
2 plans, and test marketing;

3 3. Farm diversification grants or loans to be used for projects
4 dealing with the diversification of family farms or ranches to
5 nontraditional crops, livestock, or on-farm, value-added processing
6 of agricultural commodities; and

7 4. Basic and applied research grants and loans for business
8 creation or expansion, or research which will likely lead to a
9 marketable product through the focusing of research efforts on uses
10 and processing of Oklahoma agricultural products and by-products,
11 including but not limited to:

- a. focused research which enhances the value of an
 agricultural product or by-product,
- 14 b. feasibility studies,

15 c. product development costs, and

16 d. projects that are driven by an entrepreneur or the
17 industry; and

18 <u>5. Agricultural event grants or loans for expansion or</u> 19 <u>creation of events that benefit and further the public interest in</u> 20 <u>agriculture</u>.

D. The State Board of Agriculture shall promulgate rules
 governing the Oklahoma Agriculture Enhancement and Diversification
 Program.

1 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 2 O.S. 2011, Section 5-3.3, as 2 amended by Section 4, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (2 O.S. Supp. 2014, 3 Section 5-3.3), is amended to read as follows:

Section 5-3.3 A. There is hereby created within the State
Treasury a fund for the State Board of Agriculture to be designated
the "Oklahoma Agriculture Enhancement and Diversification Fund".
The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year
limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the State
Board of Agriculture to implement and maintain the Oklahoma
Agriculture Enhancement and Diversification Program.

B. The Oklahoma Agriculture Enhancement and Diversification
Fund shall consist of:

13 1. Money received by the State Oklahoma Department of 14 Agriculture, Food, and Forestry in the form of gifts, grants, 15 appropriations, reimbursements, donations, industry contributions, 16 funds allocated by federal agencies for marketing, research and 17 agricultural development programs and such other monies specifically 18 designated for the Oklahoma Agriculture Enhancement and 19 Diversification Program. All monies accruing to the credit of the 20 fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the 21 State Board of Agriculture for the Oklahoma Agriculture Enhancement 22 and Diversification Program; and

23 2. Interest attributable to investment of money in the fund.24

C. All donations or other proceeds received by the Department pursuant to the provisions of this section shall be deposited with the State Treasurer to be credited to the Oklahoma Agriculture Enhancement and Diversification Fund. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

The monies deposited in the fund shall at no time become 8 D. 9 part of the general budget of the Department or any other state 10 agency. Except for any administration costs incurred in development 11 and implementation of the Oklahoma Agriculture Enhancement and 12 Diversification Program, no monies from the fund shall be 13 transferred for any purpose to any other state agency or to any 14 account of the State Board of Agriculture or the Department or be 15 used for the purpose of contracting with any other state agency or 16 reimbursing any other state agency for any expense.

17 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 2 O.S. 2011, Section 5-3.4, is
18 amended to read as follows:

Section 5-3.4 A. The State Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, <u>Food, and Forestry</u> shall require eligible applicants to submit information, forms and reports as are necessary to properly and efficiently administer the Oklahoma Agriculture Enhancement and Diversification Program.

1 B. Persons may apply to the State Department of Agriculture for 2 grant or loan funds to develop or implement research or marketing 3 and utilization or farm diversification plans, in accordance with rules promulgated by the State Board of Agriculture. Applications 4 5 for grant or loan funds shall be approved or denied by the Department in accordance with criteria promulgated by the Board 6 7 pursuant to the Oklahoma Agriculture Enhancement and Diversification Program. 8

9 C. The <u>Commissioner</u> <u>State Board</u> of Agriculture may also 10 allocate monies from the fund to eligible applicants on a matching 11 basis.

D. Grant or loan funds may be made available to eligible applicants pursuant to evaluation by the Department based on the following criteria:

15 1. Preference will may be given to the applicants whose: 16 industrial and nonfood production processes utilize a. 17 agricultural products, 18 b. food, feed and fiber products and uses are innovative 19 and add to the value of agricultural products, 20 applications demonstrate a high probability of job с. 21 creation and return-on-investment, 22 d. proposals feature research that is innovative as well 23 as commercially plausible, 24

- e. proposals demonstrate a high probability of rapid commercialization,
 - f. projects demonstrate a shared commitment for funding from other private or public sources or from the applicant,
- g. proposals center efforts on nonurban locales,
- h. principals are individuals, a group of individuals, an
 individual on behalf of a group, or corporations which
 meet the criteria set forth in Section 951 of Title 18
 of the Oklahoma Statutes, to market a product or
 formulate or implement a marketing plan for products
 which have not been marketed through existing
 marketing cooperatives,
- i. proposals must contain the potential to create
 additional income for the farm unit, and
- j. proposals must provide for new and innovative plans
 for marketing the product, and
- 18 <u>k. proposals for agricultural events benefit the entire</u>
 19 <u>state or a large geographic region of the state</u>; and
 20 2. Consideration shall not be given to applications for:
- a. research or marketing plans which do not clearly meet
 the stated objectives of the Oklahoma Agriculture
 Enhancement and Diversification Act,
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- b. proposals which are aimed solely at business expansion
 or creation without regard to agricultural products
 utilization, and
- c. research or marketing plans that cannot reasonably be
 expected to result in a viable commercial application,
 or that are or have been duplicated by other research
 efforts, or
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 d. proposals for agricultural events that do not result

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 in expansion of the event or encourage additional

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 public interest in the event.

11 Ε. 1. Any information submitted to or compiled by the State 12 Department of Agriculture, with respect to the marketing plans, financial statements, trade secrets, research concepts, methods or 13 14 products, or any other proprietary information of persons, firms, 15 associations, partnerships, agencies, corporations, institutions of 16 higher education, nonprofit research institutions or other entities 17 pursuant to the Oklahoma Agriculture Enhancement and Diversification 18 Program shall not be disclosed in public hearings and shall be kept 19 confidential, except to the extent that the person or entity which 20 provided such information or which is the subject of such 21 information consents to disclosure.

22 2. Executive sessions may be held to discuss such materials if23 deemed necessary by the Board.
