Sections 10-9.1 through 10-9.12 of this 13 title shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma Registered 14 Poultry Feeding Operations Act". 15 в. As used in Sections 10-9.1 through 10-9.23 of this title: 16 "Best Management Practices" or "BMPs" means schedules of 1. 17 activities, prohibitions of practices, maintenance procedures and 18 other management practices which prevent or reduce the pollution of 19 waters of the state as established by the State Oklahoma Department 20 of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry pursuant to Section 10-9.7 of 21 this title; 22 2. "Board" means the State Board of Agriculture; 23 3. "Certificate" means a written document issued to an 24 individual by the Board pursuant to Section 10-9.17 of this title

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which indicates that the individual is authorized to land\_apply
poultry waste by the Oklahoma Poultry Waste Applicators
Certification Act;

4 4. "Certified poultry waste applicator" means a person who has
5 been certified by the Board to land\_apply poultry waste and includes
6 a commercial poultry waste applicator and a private poultry waste
7 applicator;

5. "Commercial poultry waste applicator" means any person who 9 engages in commercial land application of poultry waste. Any farmer 10 while working for a neighbor in agricultural production, and not 11 advertising, nor holding himself or herself out to be in the 12 business of land\_applying poultry waste, shall not be classified as 13 a commercial poultry waste applicator, but as a private poultry 14 waste applicator;

15 6. "Contract growing arrangement" means any growout contract, 16 marketing agreement, or other arrangement under which a contract 17 poultry grower cares for or raises poultry;

18 7. "Contract poultry grower" means any person engaged in the 19 business of caring for or raising poultry, under a contract growing 20 arrangement;

8. "Common ownership" includes but is not limited to any person who has power or authority to manage, direct, restrict, regulate or oversee the operation or has financial control of two or more poultry feeding operations;

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9. "Department" means the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture,
 Food, and Forestry;

3 10. "Expanding operation" means a registered poultry feeding 4 operation that seeks to increase its registered capacity in excess 5 of ten percent (10%) of the facility's original registered capacity;

11. "Facility" means any place, site or location or part
thereof where poultry are kept, handled, housed or otherwise
maintained including but not limited to buildings, lots, pens and
poultry waste management systems;

10 12. "Integrator" means an entity which unites the elements 11 associated with the poultry industry, including but not limited to 12 hatching, feeding, processing and marketing. It includes, but is 13 not limited to, situations when growing is contracted out to others 14 and when the integrator operates its own growing facilities;

15 13. "Land application" means the spreading on, or incorporation
16 into, the soil mantle primarily for beneficial purposes;

17 14. "Nutrient Management Plan" means a written plan that 18 includes a combination of conservation and management practices 19 designed to protect the natural resources of the state as required 20 by the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry 21 pursuant to the provisions of Section 10-9.7 of this title and shall 22 also include a certified nutrient management plan and animal waste 23 management plan;

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15. "Operator" means the person who performs the daily 1 2 management functions associated with the poultry feeding operation; "Person" means an individual, association, partnership, 3 16. 4 firm, company, public trust, corporation, joint stock company, trust 5 estate, any other legal entity, or any agent, employee, representative assignor or successor thereof; 6 7 "Nutrient-limited watershed" means a watershed of a water 17. body which is designated as "nutrient-limited" in the most recent 8 9 Oklahoma's Oklahoma Water Quality Standards; 10 18. "Nutrient-vulnerable groundwater" means groundwater which is designated "nutrient-vulnerable" in the most recent Oklahoma's 11 12 Oklahoma Water Quality Standards; 13 19. "Poultry" includes chickens, turkeys, ducks, geese and any 14 other domesticated bird used for human food and/or animal feed; 15 20. "Poultry feeding operation" means a property or facility 16 where the following conditions are met: 17 poultry have been, are or will be confined and fed or a. 18 maintained for a total of forty-five (45) days or more 19 in any twelve-month period, 20 b. crops, vegetation, forage growth or post-harvest 21 residues are not sustained in the normal growing 22 season over any portion of the property or facility, 23 and 24

c. producing over ten (10) tons of poultry waste per year;

3 21. "Poultry waste" means poultry excrement, poultry carcasses, 4 feed wastes, bedding materials, or any other waste associated with 5 the confinement of poultry from a poultry feeding operation;

6 22. "Poultry waste utilization business" means a business at 7 which poultry waste is collected, recycled, processed or recovered 8 into reusable products including, but not limited to, fertilizer and 9 animal feed;

10 23. "Poultry waste management system" means a combination of 11 structures and practices serving a poultry feeding operation that 12 provides for the collection, treatment, disposal, distribution, 13 storage and land application of poultry waste;

14 24. 23. "Private poultry waste applicator" means any person who 15 is not a commercial poultry waste applicator but engages in the land 16 application of poultry waste for purposes including, but not limited 17 to, producing any agricultural commodity on property owned or rented 18 by the person or such person's employer, or if applied without 19 compensation other than trading of personal services between 20 producers of agricultural commodities, on the property of another 21 person;

22 <u>25. 24.</u> "Waste facility" means any structure or combination of 23 structures utilized to control poultry waste until it can be 24 utilized in an authorized manner; and

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1 26. 25. "Waters of the state" means all streams, lakes, ponds, 2 marshes, watercourses, waterways, wells, springs, irrigation systems, drainage systems, storm sewers and all other bodies or 3 4 accumulations of water, surface and underground, natural or 5 artificial, public or private, which are contained within, flow through or border upon this state or any portion thereof, and shall 6 7 include under all circumstances the waters of the United States which are contained within the boundaries of, flow through or border 8 9 upon this state or any portion thereof. Process wastewaters shall 10 not be considered as waters of the state if contaminated at the 11 site.

Section 10-9.3 A. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to construct or operate a new poultry feeding operation without having first registered with the State Board of Agriculture.

17 2. The owner or operator of a poultry operation not classified
18 as a poultry feeding operation may register if such owner or
19 operator elects to come under the provisions of the Oklahoma
20 Registered Poultry Feeding Operations Act and the rules of the
21 Board.

B. Every poultry feeding operation in operation on the
effective date of this act shall register within six (6) months of
the effective date of this act.

C. Any poultry feeding operation that has a valid license
 pursuant to the Oklahoma Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations Act
 shall not be required to register pursuant to the Oklahoma
 Registered Poultry Feeding Operations Act.

5 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 2 O.S. 2011, Section 10-9.4, is 6 amended to read as follows:

7 Section 10-9.4 A. Every poultry feeding operation shall be 8 required to register annually to operate pursuant to the Oklahoma 9 Registered Poultry Feeding Operations Act and rules promulgated 10 pursuant thereto.

B. 1. Two or more poultry operations under common ownership are considered, for the purposes of registration, to be a single poultry feeding operation if they adjoin each other or if they use a common waste facility.

Once the cumulative amount of poultry waste produced by all 16 facilities owned or managed by a person meets or exceeds the amount 17 specified by paragraph 20 of Section ± 10-9.1 of this act title, all 18 poultry feeding operations owned by the person shall be required to 19 become registered.

3. After the effective date of this act, any poultry feeding
operation shall be required to reregister for any increase in excess
of ten percent (10%) of the facility's original registered capacity.
SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 2 O.S. 2011, Section 10-9.5, is

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Section 10-9.5 A. The State Board of Agriculture shall cause

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D. The owner of a poultry feeding operation shall be
 responsible for sending written notification to the Department upon
 changing integrators.

E. For a transfer of registration to a new owner, the new owner
shall register the operation pursuant to the rules of the
Department.

7 1. All operators of poultry feeding operations and poultry F. waste applicators shall attend educational courses on poultry waste 8 9 handling. All such operators and applicators shall attend 10 educational training on poultry waste management as provided by 11 Oklahoma State University through the Oklahoma Cooperative Extension 12 Service. All current and new operators and applicators shall 13 receive the initial nine (9) hours of training in the first year and 14 two hours of continuing education every year until the operator or 15 applicator has received a total of nineteen (19) hours of training. 16 Any operator or applicator may attend more hours than is required, 17 however, those hours shall not be carried forward. Upon receiving 18 the nineteen (19) required hours, the operator or applicator will 19 graduate from the program but shall be required to receive two (2) 20 hours of continuing education every three (3) years. The Oklahoma 21 Cooperative Extension Service shall develop the educational training 22 course to aid in certification. Curricula for the training course 23 will include the Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service Waste 24 Management Facts series and record books or their current

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1 equivalent. Courses for poultry waste management shall include the 2 following topics:

The 16 certificates shall be kept on site for five (5) years. 17 3. Failure to obtain the initial nine-hour training and any 18 continuing education as provided in this subsection shall be deemed 19 a violation of the Oklahoma Registered Poultry Feeding Operations 20 Act for operators and the Oklahoma Poultry Waste Applicators 21 Certification Act for applicators. 22 4. All operators or applicators shall meet the educational 23 requirements of this section no later than December 31 of each year. 24

G. No integrator shall enter into any contract with an operator
 of a poultry feeding operation who is not in compliance with the
 education requirements of subsection F of this section.

SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 2 O.S. 2011, Section 10-9.7, as

Section 10-9.7 A. All poultry feeding operations shall utilize
Best Management Practices and shall meet the conditions and
requirements established by subsection B of this section and by
rules promulgated by the State Board of Agriculture pursuant to the
Oklahoma Registered Poultry Feeding Operations Act.

B. The criteria for Best Management Practices shall be promulgated by rules by the Board and shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

15 1. There shall be no discharge of poultry waste to waters of 16 the state;

17 2. Stored poultry waste shall be isolated from outside surface 18 drainage by <u>covers</u>, ditches, dikes, berms, terraces or other such 19 structures;

3. No waters of the state shall come into direct contact withthe poultry confined on the poultry feeding operation;

4. Poultry waste handling, treatment, management and removalshall:

24 a. not create an environmental or a public health hazard,

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- b. not result in the contamination of waters of the
   state, and
- c. conform to such other handling, treatment and
  management and removal requirements deemed necessary
  by the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and
  Forestry to implement the Oklahoma Registered Poultry
  Feeding Operations Act and rules promulgated pursuant
  thereto.

9 The rules promulgated by the Board pursuant to this section 10 shall provide for exceptions to the storage requirements for poultry 11 waste in emergency situations. 5. Land<u>-</u>application rates of poultry waste shall be based on the available nitrogen and phosphorous content of the poultry waste and shall provide controls for runoff and erosion as appropriate for site conditions;

7 6. The procedures documented in the Nutrient Management Plan
8 must shall ensure that the handling and utilization of poultry waste
9 complies with the following requirements:

a. adequate poultry waste storage shall be provided
 consistent with rules promulgated by the Oklahoma
 Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry pursuant
 to subsection B of this section,

b. poultry waste shall not be applied to land when the
ground is saturated or during rainfall events.
Poultry waste shall not be applied to land when the
ground is frozen except in conformance with the
Nutrient Management Plan,

c. poultry waste shall only be applied to suitable land
at appropriate times and rates. Discharge or runoff
of waste from the application site is prohibited.
Timing and rate of applications shall be based on

 Application rate based upon current United States Department

Every poultry feeding operation located in a nutrientlimited watershed and nutrient-vulnerable groundwater shall perform an annual soil test on each land application area prior to the first application of the calendar year. Poultry waste testing shall be performed annually prior to the first application of the calendar

1. Is not in substantial compliance with a final agency order or any final order or judgment of a court of record secured by any state or federal agency relating to poultry feeding operations; or

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2. Has evidenced a reckless disregard for the protection of the
 public and the environment as demonstrated by a history of
 noncompliance with environmental laws and rules resulting in
 endangerment of human health or the environment.

C. Any action taken in regard to the denial, suspension or
revocation of a license shall be in conformity with the rules of the
Board governing administrative procedures and with the
Administrative Procedures Act.

9 D. The Board shall promulgate rules which will provide a 10 procedure whereby any poultry feeding operation which has been 11 designated a concentrated animal feeding operation pursuant to this 12 section may have such designation removed. The rules shall require 13 satisfactory evidence that such designation is no longer necessary 14 in order to ensure that the operation will comply with all 15 provisions of the Oklahoma Registered Poultry Feeding Operations Act 16 and will not contribute to pollution of the waters of this state.

4. Any person assessed an administrative penalty may be
required to pay, in addition to such penalty amount and interest
thereon, attorneys attorney fees and costs associated with the

C. 1. Any action for injunctive relief to redress or restrain
a violation by any person of the Oklahoma Registered Poultry Feeding
Operations Act, or for any rule promulgated thereunder, or order
issued pursuant thereto, or recovery of any administrative penalty

F. Any person issued an applicator's certificate shall comply
with the <u>education</u> provisions of subsection F of Section 10-9.5 of

 shall publish an annual report containing the following information:

14 1. The total amount of poultry waste produced in each

obtain the most recent soil and poultry waste tests as required by

watershed and non-nutrient-vulnerable groundwaters shall not be made
at any rate which exceeds the most recently published United States

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The Animal Waste Nutrient Management Plan, if application is

The Conservation Plan, if application is conducted on land
 operated by entities not regulated pursuant to the <u>Oklahoma</u>

B. The State Board of Agriculture shall have the authority to negotiate reciprocal agreements with the federal government or any state, or any department or agency of either for the purpose of fulfilling the intent of the Oklahoma Poultry Waste Applicators Certification Act.

C. The Department may take samples of poultry waste and soil at application sites in order to determine their concentration. The work of each applicator may be inspected at the application site of

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each applicator to determine whether or not the work is performed
 according to the provisions of the Oklahoma Poultry Waste
 Applicators Certification Act.

Section 10-9.23 The Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service shall provide to the Secretary of the Environment no later than January 31, 1999, and January 31 of each following year, a written report of their educational activities involving poultry operators and waste applicators pursuant to this act. This report shall include, but not be limited to:

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The number of operators and applicators enrolled in courses
 required in the first year listed by conservation district county;
 The number of operators successfully completing such courses

4 listed by conservation district county;

3. The number of operators and applicators enrolled in courses
required in subsequent years listed by conservation district county;
and

8 4. The number of operators successfully completing such courses
9 listed by conservation district county.

10 The Secretary of the Environment shall use the data provided in 11 this report along with water quality monitoring and other 12 environmental data to evaluate the effectiveness of the curriculum 13 offered. The Secretary shall work in conjunction with the Oklahoma 14 Cooperative Extension Service to correct any course deficiencies 15 identified in the evaluation.
