Wildlife damage management of predatory animals and other wildlife species causing damage shall include but not be limited to 6 7 hunting, trapping, or other practical methods for the control of wildlife damage to resources. Operations shall be directly 8 9 supervised by the United States Department of Agriculture Wildlife 10 Services in association with the Department. The Department is 11 authorized to enter into cooperative agreements with counties, 12 associations, corporations, and individuals for hunting and trapping operations and control of wildlife damage. 13

In cooperation with Wildlife Services, the Department is 14 15 authorized to purchase wildlife animal damage management supplies, including but not limited to bait, for cooperating governmental 16 agencies, counties, associations, corporations, and individuals for 17 the control of damage caused by predatory animals and other wildlife 18 species. The Department shall make these supplies and baits 19 available to cooperators at approximate cost. The receipts from the 20 sale of supplies and baits shall be credited to the State Department 21 of Agriculture Revolving Fund. 22

17 successfully pass a background check by the Oklahoma Department of

18 Agriculture, Food, and Forestry and be trained in accordance with

19 United States Department of Agriculture Wildlife Services guidelines

20 for the use of firearms in wildlife damage management.

The names of agents authorized by the Board to carry <del>a rifle and</del> <del>shotgun</del> <u>firearms</u> shall be furnished to the <u>Oklahoma</u> Department of Public Safety.
