## AN ACT

5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
8	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
9	<u>§ 6129. Identification required for purchase of firearm</u>
10	ammunition.
11	(a) IdentificationExcept as provided under subsection
12	(b), no person may sell or deliver firearm ammunition to a
13	purchaser or transferee unless the purchaser or transferee
14	presents an official form of photographic identification,
15	including, but not limited to, a driver's license, official
16	Pennsylvania photo identification card or official government
17	photo identification card.
18	(b) ExceptionAn individual who is a member of a

1	recognized religious sect or community whose tenets forbid or
2	discourage the taking of photographs of members of that sect or
3	<u>community may present a valid-without-photo driver's license or</u>
4	a combination of documents, as prescribed by the Pennsylvania
5	State Police, containing the individual's name, address, date of
6	birth and signature.
7	(c) PenaltiesA person that violates this section shall be
8	subject to a fine of:
9	(1) \$1,000 for a first offense.
10	(2) \$2,000 for a second offense.
11	(3) \$3,000 for a third or subsequent offense.
12	(d) Prohibition on ammunition salesA person that violates
13	this section shall be prohibited from selling ammunition for 30
14	<u>days following a third or subsequent offense.</u>
15	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
