## AN ACT

Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 1 Statutes, in general provisions, further defining 2 "interactive wireless communications device"; and in rules of 3 the road in general, prohibiting use of interactive wireless 4 communications device, and further providing for duty of 5 driver in construction and maintenance areas or on highway 6 7 safety corridors and for duty of driver in emergency response areas. 8 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 hereby enacts as follows: 11 Section 1. The definition of "interactive wireless 12 communications device" in section 102 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended to read: 13 § 102. Definitions. 14 15 Subject to additional definitions contained in subsequent 16 provisions of this title which are applicable to specific provisions of this title, the following words and phrases when 17 used in this title shall have, unless the context clearly 18 19 indicates otherwise, the meanings given to them in this section:

"Interactive wireless communications device." A wireless 2 3 telephone, personal digital assistant, smart phone, portable or mobile computer or similar device which can be used for voice 4 communication, texting, e-mailing, browsing the Internet or 5 6 instant messaging. The term does not include any of the 7 following: 8 (1)a device being used exclusively as a global 9 positioning or navigation system; 10 a system or device that is physically or (2) 11 electronically integrated into the vehicle; [or] 12 a communications device that is affixed to a mass (3)13 transit vehicle, bus or school bus[.]; or 14 (4) an amateur radio or a citizens band radio. 15 \* \* \* Section 2. Sections 3316, 3326(c) and 3327(e) of Title 75 16 are amended to read: 17 18 § 3316. Prohibiting [text-based communications] use of 19 interactive wireless communications device. 20 (a) Prohibition.--[No driver] 21 (1) Except as provided in subsection (b), no person 22 shall [operate] drive a motor vehicle on a [highway] roadway 23 or trafficway in this Commonwealth while using an interactive 24 wireless communications device [to send, read or write a 25 text-based communication while the vehicle is in motion. A 26 person does not send, read or write a text-based 27 communication when the person reads, selects or enters a 28 telephone number or name in an interactive wireless 29 communications device for the purpose of activating or 30 deactivating a voice communication or a telephone call.] for 20150HB0652PN0751

Seizure.--The provisions of this section shall not be 3 (C) construed as authorizing the seizure or forfeiture of an 4 interactive wireless communications device, unless otherwise 5 6 provided by law. 7 (d) Penalty.--8 (1) A person who violates subsection (a) commits a 9 summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to 10 pay a fine of \$50. 11 (2) A person who violates subsection (a) while passing 12 through a school zone, as defined and provided under the regulations of the department, commits a summary offense and 13 14 shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$100. An official traffic-control device shall indicate the 15 beginning and end of each school zone to traffic approaching 16 17 in each direction. Establishment of a school zone, including 18 its location and hours of operation, shall be approved by the 19 department. 20 (e) Preemption of local ordinances.--In accordance with 21 section 6101 (relating to applicability and uniformity of title), this section supersedes and preempts all ordinances of 22 any municipality with regard to the use of an interactive 23 24 wireless communications device by the driver of a motor vehicle. 25 (e.1) Public education and awareness programs.--The 26 department shall develop and maintain Statewide public education 27 and awareness programs to combat distracted driving and promote awareness of the provisions of this section. 28 29 [Definition.--As used in this section, the term "text-(f) based communication" means a text message, instant message, 30 20150HB0652PN0751 - 4 -
