| 40 | WHEREAS, the Virginia Statute for Religious Freedom established that all individuals |
| 41 | are free to believe as they will and that this shall in no wise diminish, enlarge, or affect their |

| 43 | WHEREAS, the Supreme Court of the United States has recognized repeatedly that the |
| 44 | Virginia Statute for Religious Freedom right was an important influence in the development of |
| 45 | the United States Constitution and the Bill of Rights: |
| 46 | NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of the state of Utah, the |
| 47 | Governor concurring therein, designates January 16th each year as "Religious Freedom Day" in |
| 48 | the state of Utah. |
| 49 | BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature and the Governor urge citizens and |
| 50 | local governments to remember and honor the nation's first Religious Freedom law, as written |
| 51 | and championed by Thomas Jefferson and James Madison $\hat{H} \rightarrow$, and the enduring religious |
| 51a | freedom guaranteed in the United States and Utah constitutions $\leftarrow \hat{H}$. |
