	(1) There is created within the division the Utah Fire Prevention Board.



28	(2) The board shall be nonpartisan and be composed of $[10]$ 13 members appointed by
29	the governor as follows:
30	(a) a city or county official;
31	(b) a licensed architect;
32	(c) a licensed engineer;
33	(d) a member of the Utah State Firemen's Association;
34	(e) the state forester;
35	(f) the commissioner of the Labor Commission or the commissioner's designee;
36	(g) a member of the Utah State Fire Chiefs Association;
37	(h) a member of the Utah Fire Marshal's Association;
38	(i) a building inspector; [and]
39	(j) a citizen appointed at large[-];
40	(k) a fire executive appointed from a full-time fire department in a county of the first

42	(1) a fire executive appointed from a full-time fire department in a county of the second

46	(3) (a) Except as required by Subsection (3)(b), as terms of current board members

50	time of appointment or reappointment, adjust the length of terms to ensure that the terms of
